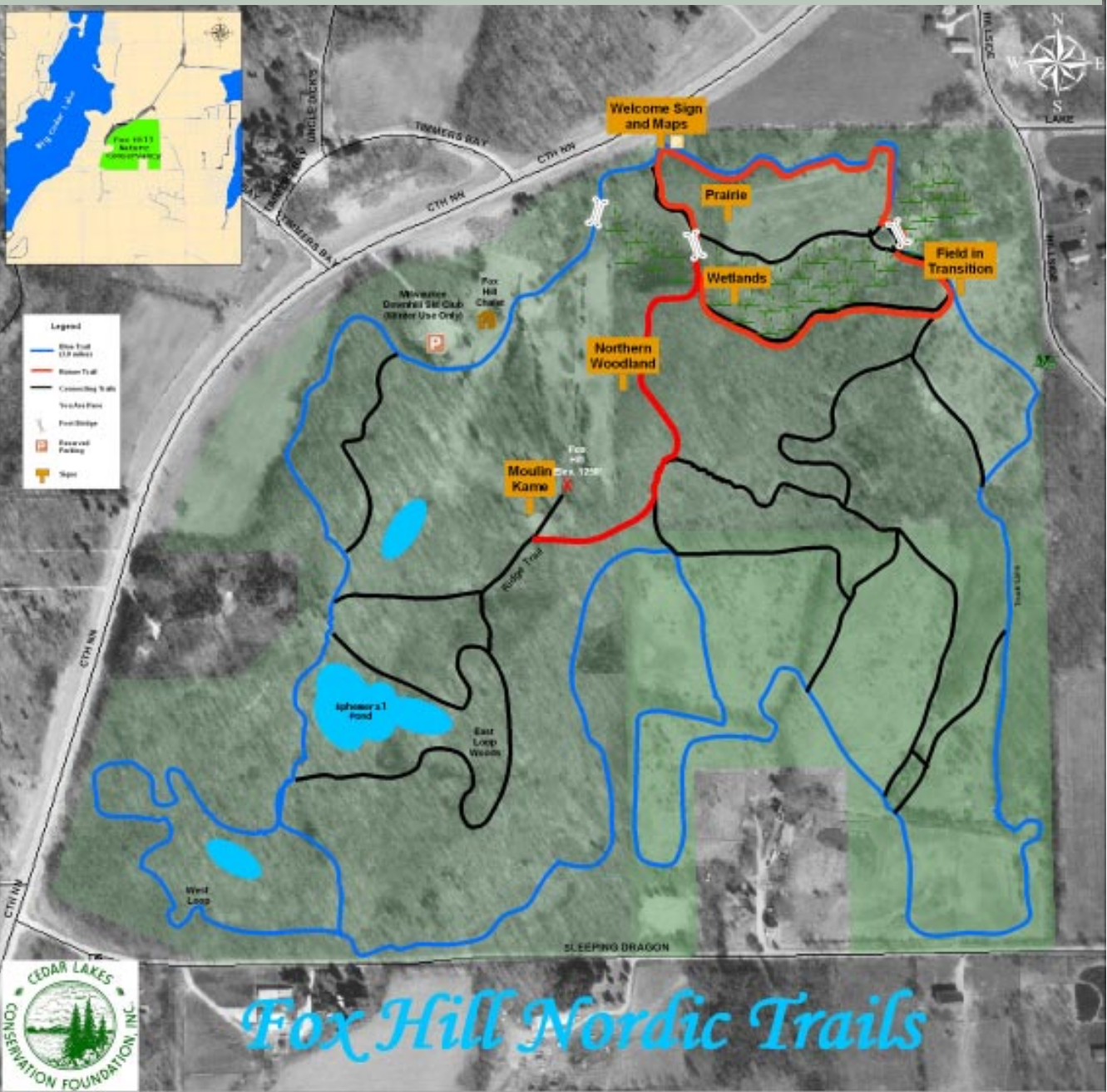


Trail Etiquette:

Trail use is intended for the quiet and safe enjoyment of all who visit. For that reason, motorized and non-motorized vehicles are not allowed. Hunting is similarly prohibited. During winter months, hikers are asked to keep off of groomed ski trails. New trails for hikers and snowshoe enthusiasts are often carved each year by volunteers.

Hiking

Each season offers a special view of flora and fauna for hikers to enjoy. Be sure to bring family and friends of all ages and visit often! Interpretive signs will inform visitors. Trails are groomed in winter for cross-country skiing and otherwise maintained the rest of the year. A map on the back of this brochure, along with trail markers, will guide your adventure!



Skiing

Expertly groomed Nordic ski trails are located within the Conservancy. Skiers are encouraged to join Fox Hill Nordic Ski Club. The club has formed a partnership with Cedar Lakes Conservation Foundation and Milwaukee Downhill Ski Club to provide for parking, use of the chalet, and shared trail maintenance responsibilities.

Downhill

Slopes to satisfy beginner to expert downhill enthusiasts are available to members of Milwaukee Downhill Ski Club. The club's property boasts six runs, four rope tows, and no waiting. Skiers are invited to visit and join!

Prairie Restoration

In 1999, volunteers began to restore five acres of abandoned farm field to native Wisconsin prairie. Seventy-four native species were hand-cast, section by section, over the prepared field. Today, volunteers continue to work during each month of the growing season. Everyone is welcome to join in the rewarding work. Wildflowers that bloom throughout the season display a changing palette of color. Experts guide volunteers who enjoy fun, fellowship and refreshments. Nature

The Conservancy is located along Highway NN in the Town of West Bend -- the heart of Wisconsin's Kettle Moraine region. It protects land located between the State's northern and southern units. Excellent examples of geological features that are the result of glacial retreat are featured on the property.

Important and sensitive habitats are also protected by the Conservancy. Rare examples of wetlands, ephemeral ponds, and northern hardwood forest create safe havens for wildlife. Native grasses and wildflowers continue to attract even more species to the preserve.

Please enjoy your visit and tread lightly. Quiet visitors are likely to catch a glimpse of some of the many reasons to preserve natural areas in our watersheds!
